LANGUAGE CREDIT BY PLACEMENT (Chapter 8. p.69) An accepted, degree-seeking UAA student who has completed in residence a Department of Languages UAA catalog course (A102-A302) with a grade of B or better is eligible to receive credit for the two immediately preceding courses, if any, up to a total of 8 credits.

This policy does not apply to credit earned through the College Board Advanced Placement Examination Program, nor to Special Topics (_93), Independent Study (_97), Language Self Study (LANG prefix), or Department of Languages literature or culture courses. In order to receive credit, the student must complete the appropriate form from Enrollment Services and pay an administrative fee of \$20.00.

ADVANCED PLACEMENT PROGRAM (Chapter 8. p.70) UAA awards credit for satisfactory performance (a score of 3 or higher) on the College Board Advanced Placement Examinations. These exams are normally completed by students during their senior year in high school. A student may receive credit for more than one Advanced Placement Exam.
