Description of Scholarships
and Procedure for Applications

The Elmer & Ruth Schwantes Scholarship Fund awards scholarship(s) for study at colleges, universities, and trade and technical schools located in the United States. A student who is awarded a scholarship for one year may reapply for successive years, up to a total of four years of undergraduate study plus one additional year if enrolled in a university-approved five year undergraduate program. The applications will be considered anew each year. Applicants must be graduates of Alaska high schools or Spencer High School in Spencer, Wisconsin. The scholarship(s) will be awarded based upon a combination of need and merit. Scholarship awards for the 2011-2012 academic year will be determined from applicants with a GPA of 2.5 or higher.

If you wish to apply for a scholarship, please send the Board a copy of your "Scholarship Folder", based upon the design of such folders as used in the Anchorage School District. (One on-line internet source for a scholarship application model is available from the Anchorage School District's website at <http://www.asdk12.org/CRC/guidelines.asp>.) If you do not have internet access, your school counselor can assist you in assembling this information. Applications must be postmarked or hand delivered by March 31, 2011.

The Board of Directors of the Fund will carefully review your application. The Board may contact you and request additional information or an interview. You will be notified of the Board's decisions.
