Habitat for Humanity Intensive

Grade Level: 9-12

Participate in a fun, meaningful, and hands on spring intensive while providing a valuable community service! Habitat for Humanity is an international organization that changes lives by providing low-income families the opportunity to purchase affordable homes. Students will work at a local Habitat for Humanity jobsite, helping with various stages of home construction. No experience is necessary: training will be provided! Since we will be working at an active construction site, students are expected to be safe and responsible and to dress appropriately. *This intensive is open to students 14 and older.* Students must be at least 16 years old to work at the jobsite; 14 and 15 year olds will be able to work at the Habitat ReStore and will be able to tour the jobsite the first week.

Credit: .25 Community Service elective

Course: Digital Story Telling

This intensive will focus on the contemporary practice of digital storytelling as a way of teaching written and verbal language skills, creative problem solving, and software development. At its root, this program teaches storytelling in regional, traditional, and contemporary formats using digital media: videos, mobile computing, websites, videogames, and mixed reality. The basic idea would be to have the students look at some oral tradition and video storytelling, then pick some techniques and start telling stories using video and augmented reality.

Course: Pyrography

Teacher: John

Grade Level: 7-12

Put your inner fire-smith talents to good use; this will be a studio art intensive using the art form of pyrography

Pyrography, "writing with fire", or **pyrogravure** is the art of decorating by burning or scorching designs onto wood, leather, or other materials with marks resulting from the controlled application of a heated object.

You may know of this traditional art process by its less glamorous name...wood burning (we'll be using wood burners - which you get to keep) using the same process that has been practiced by a number of cultures including the early Egyptians and African since the dawn of recorded history...truly an art form that dates back to prehistory, when early humans created designs using the charred remains of their fires.

Class size: 24 students Credit: .25 Art Elective

Cost: \$ 55*, for: wood burner (which you get to keep), wood, pattern books and transfer paper *(class fees must be paid before you will be able to do any wood burning)

Course: Figure Drawing & Painting

Grade Level: 7-12

No more funny looking humans, no more cartoons. Learn the anatomy of the human figure and how to draw it accurately. This class will allow you to begin applying an understanding of the human figure in your art. Life Hacks-How to Survive in the Real World

Grade Level: 10-12 (Preference will be given to upper grade students)

Are you feeling overwhelmed about the prospect of living on your own? Need some practical skills to help you survive in our urban world? If so, this class is for you. This class will focus on the practical knowledge you will need once you leave high school. Each day a different topic will be focused on, with both practical knowledge given and lots of hands on activities. Sample topics and activities include:

- • **Car maintenance** where we will learn the basics such as changing a flat, checking fluids, and changing your oil. Students will have the opportunity to bring in their cars and actually change their own oil or work with someone else.
- • **Personal finances** will be a major focus and topics included will be budgeting, savings, taxes, loans, credit cards, and more. Students will also build a resume, practice for an interview, and can either look into career ideas, college planning, or can even spend time filling out applications for a summer job.
- • **Domestic knowledge:** Students will spend time in the kitchen learning basic cooking and meal planning. Also stain removal, basic sewing, and house maintenance will be covered.
- Fun skills and life hacks will also be covered, such as learning how to waltz, table setting 101, tying a tie, and more!!

Course: Introduction to Code Writing

Java (programming language) and android systems.

- Lab based class means lots of time to explore and develop at your own pace.

Students will explore and develop beginning level skills writing code in the Java language—one of the most popular and flexible computer languages in use today, particularly for web applications. Classes will be taught in 15 minute demonstrations followed by lab time to practice on computers and android devices. Teachers are very enthusiastic and flexible. First week is definitely all about working in Java. Week two can be more Java or move on to android applications.

Course: Science Fact, Science Fiction Psuedo Science, Teacher: Michael

Grade Level: 7-12

Imagination is more important than knowledge. For knowledge is limited to all we now know and understand, while imagination embraces the entire world, and all there ever will be to know and understand. Albert Einstein

This course will examine the relationship between the imaginary products of science fiction, and the actual science that allows many of these creations to exist in the real world. Going where no class has gone before we will use film and literature to explore the path from the impossible to the common place. The class will also discuss the ethical dilemmas created by technology, both present and future. We will conclude by investigating modern pseudoscience, and determine how it is different from traditional science fiction.
