BOOKING A PERFORMANCE FOR YOUR CLASS

Book all performances by emailing miller_rees@asdk12.org. Include your show name, date, number of students, number of chaperones and any additional information we need to accommodate your group.

All day-time school performance tickets are \$8.00 per student. One (1) chaperone is free for every 10 students. Additional chaperones pay at the student rate.

Payments may be made with a check on the day of the event or by using a P-Card online at our theatre link at west.asdk12.org. Transfers may be made with IFAS through arrangement between your school's AA and Terah Lowe, West's Activities Clerk. IFAS and P-Card payments should be made IN ADVANCE of the performance. Please note that P-Card and IFAS payments are your BEST option with built in receipts. We are not able to generate receipts for check payments on the day of the performance immediately. Due to district guidelines, we are **no longer able to accept cash** payments.

If you will be using an ASD bus to get to the performance, please schedule the bus yourself. Use **185006-3130** as the billing number and West High will pick up the tab. Be judicious with buses and use them ONLY to get to and from the show. Additional travel will be billed to you. Where possible, share. If you must cancel buses or tickets, you must do so AT LEAST 10 school days in advance or you will be charged for the bus or seating. There are no refunds given for tickets, so please make sure your counts are accurate.

School shows always begin at 10 AM. It is important that students are seated and the curtain lifts at the appointed hour. Please make sure you schedule your transportation appropriately.

Please note that show durations listed are approximate and often include Q&A sessions with the cast after the performance. If you would like a backstage tour, please make arrangements with us at least 10 days in advance of the show.

We love bringing theatre to students throughout Anchorage. Please help us continue to do so by discussing proper audience decorum with your students before you get to the performance.
